

## Welcome to The Common Room



I'm here to show you this Visual Story. It will help you plan how to get in and around The Common Room and **prepare** for what you might see and do.

### **Getting Here**

We are a short distance from Newcastle Central Station for visitors travelling by **train** and **metro**. Our nearest **bus** stops are located on Neville St, Westgate Rd and Grainger St. We have **bike** racks outside our building. There are several **car** parks close by.





# Outside the Building

Our building is on a main road. It can sometimes be **noisy**, because of cars.

We have two doors. The door on the corner has some **steps**. The glass double door on Orchard Street is **automatic** and accessible.






### Entrance


Our accessible entrance has a step lift, or four small steps with a hand rail.

When you walk inside, you will see our **floor plan**, to help you learn your way around the building. Only the Ground Floor, Floor M and Floor 1 are for public access.



# The 5|Quarter Café

Our café is located to the right of our accessible entrance. It isn't open everyday, so sometimes it is closed.

The café can be **busy**, and the coffee machine can be loud. You can **check the menu before** your visit on our website.





### **The Ground Floor**

Our Foyer has lots of **seating**, and it's often **quiet**. From here you can reach the Café, The Reece Room and the Lecture Theatre.

To get to other floors, there is a staircase. There is also a **door to the lift**, and **male and female toilets**.





### **The Lift**

Only the Ground Floor, Floor M and Floor 1 are for **public access**.

The buttons for Floor 3 and 4 only work with a special key.

Buttons are tactile with brail numbers. There is a hand rail inside the lift.






# Toilets & Baby-Changing

We have toilets on every floor.

To get to our accessible toilets and baby-changing facilities, take the lift to Floor M, and follow the signs for 'Accessible Toilet'.

Hand-dryers can be **noisy**.





### **The Reece Room**

The Reece Room is **often locked.** It is a **quiet** room where people study. Ask a member of staff if you would like some quiet time in here.

### Food and drink are not allowed in

this room, to ensure our old documents don't get damaged.





### **The Lecture Theatre**

Access from the Foyer has double doors and **steps down** into the Lecture Theatre. **Level access** is via the door by the lift on Floor G. Ask a member of staff with a key to help you through.

Some of our shows can be **noisy** with **low light levels**. This room has lots of seats, so it can be **busy**.






### **The Stairs**

There are 18 steps between the Ground Floor and the Floor M landing area.

There are 10 steps between the Floor M landing are and Floor 1. The stairs are wide, with a **hand rail** on each side.






# Exploring the Wood Hall

There are 2 steps into the Wood Hall from the Level M landing. **Level access** is via the lift to Floor M, then follow the signs for Wood Hall.

This is a big room, and it's **layout** often changes. It can get noisy and busy. There's lots to see, it's okay to take a break.






### **The First Floor**

You can reach the Floor 1 landing via the lift or stairs.

From here you can reach the Map Room, the Meeting Room and the Stephenson Room.

There are **female toilets** on this floor.





### **The Map Room**

This room is a workshop and exhibition space. We display old artefacts in here, it is important to be **careful** around them. We use **low lighting levels** in here, and **spotlights** are used on some information panels.

During exhibitions there are are **seats** in this room where you can **take a break**. Some exhibitions have **background noise**.





# The Stephenson Room

This room is a workshop and **activity** space. It can get busy, so it's okay to **take a break** outside or ask a member of staff for a quiet space.

There are lots of seats in this room, you are free to sit anywhere and **move around**.





### Safety

In case of a fire, the fire alarm makes a loud noise.

A member of staff will help you out of the building, or to the refuge points.

Do not go back inside the building until a staff member says it is safe to do so.



## Taking Breaks & Home Time

If you need to take or break or would like to go home, tell the adult that you are with.

A member of staff will help you to find a quiet spot to take break.
